Wallets Marts Castle Douglas Limited continued their fortnightly sale of Store and OTM cattle on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> July when they sold 94 head

Despite the current gloomy beef prices all classes of cattle were sold well above sellers expectations with yearling Charolais cattle being especially well bid for. Topping the sale at £1190 was an Aberdeen Angus bullock from Messrs McHarrie, High Glenjorie. High Glenjorie also sold the top price per kg of 228.6p for a pen of yearling Limousins. Charolais crosses from the same home made 228p per kg. A pen of salers cross heifers from Falbae topped their section selling at £1040. Again Charolais crosses from High Glenjorie were the top price per kg at 219.5p

Overall sale averages levelled at 195.4p for bullocks and 200.3p for heifers.

OTM cattle were a well fleshed show and met strong demand selling to £1114.08 for a Simmental cow from High Borgue and to 141p for a Simmental of Culnaightrie. A Limousin bull from Garmartin made 145p per kg or £1322.40. Sale average levelled at 124.43p per kg.
